

Nev. lawmakers back bills to end federal pot industry impediments

Two members of Nevada's congressional delegation signed onto cannabis-related legislation last week in a push to legitimize the emerging marijuana industry at the federal level.

U.S. Sen. Catherine Cortez Masto and Rep. Dina Titus, both Democrats, co-sponsored bills that would remove federal restrictions that the marijuana industry says hamstringing participants from operating as normal businesses.

Twenty-eight states have legalized medical marijuana, and eight of those states – including Nevada – have also legalized recreational use. The moves have created an emerging industry that generates billions of dollars in sales and hundreds of millions in tax revenue for states.

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
