How authorities missed Garrido

As lawyers prepare for Thursday's sentencing of Phillip and Nancy Garrido in the kidnapping of Jaycee Lee Dugard, questions remain concerning his parole supervision during the time that she was abducted, raped and gave birth to two daughters fathered by her captor.

Documents acquired exclusively by the *Reno Gazette-Journal* through a federal lawsuit reveal that the officials handling his case from the very beginning were by all accounts fooled.

- * Edgewood Tahoe (a few tickets are still available)
- * Nevada beach in Zephyr Cove

- * Kahle Community Park just off Kingsbury Grade
- * Bijou Community Park.
