

North Tahoe has grant money for events

The North Lake Tahoe Chamber/CVB/Resort Association has \$50,000 in grant money to help event organizers in eastern Placer County.

The grant funds are to support the promotion of events outside of the Lake Tahoe market in order to generate increased local and regional business revenue, create media exposure and promote overnight visitation. Specific eligible expenses covered by the grant include geographic area advertising such TV, radio, print and Internet, production and printing of promotional materials such as brochures, flyers and posters, production and printing of directional/informational signage and marketing and promotion in support of events which benefit more than one geographic area of the region, or the region as a whole.

Expenses not covered by the grant include capital investments, salaries, operational overhead, vehicle expenses, food, beverage, entertainment, transportation, supplies, equipment, security, clean up or facility rentals.

Applications must be received by Sept. 9

Douglas County hosting stormwater meetings

Staff will explain how a stormwater management program and utility fee might work. A presentation will be given at each meeting and will include recommendations from the Citizen's Flood Task Force, examples of how a stormwater management program could work. Public input will be sought, too.

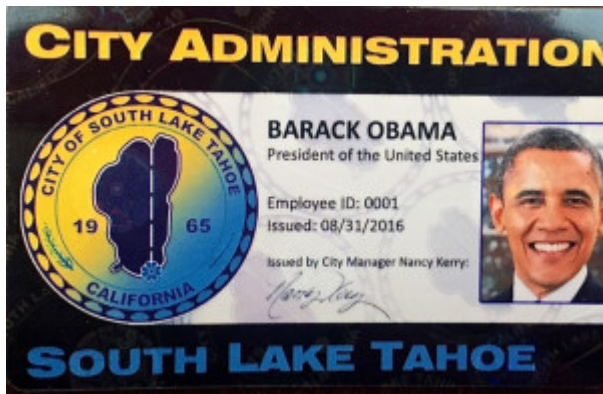
On Aug. 18 the Douglas County Board of Commissioners approved a contract with House Moran Consulting for the implementation of the Douglas County Stormwater Utility.

CalFire has grant money for fire prevention

CalFire is giving nearly \$16 million in fire prevention grants to local fire departments and fire safe councils to reduce the threat of large wildfires.

The 2016-17 State Responsibility Area Fire Prevention Fund and tree mortality grants are aimed at reducing the threat wildfires as well as dead and dying trees in and around communities within the State Responsibility Area, which includes the Lake Valley area.

These grants have a one-time appropriation of \$10 million that is intended to address the risk and potential impact of wildfire and dead and dying trees on habitable structures in the SRA. The grants also provide a one-time allocation of \$6 million for fire prevention projects that are not limited to the SRA.

Applications are due Sept. 28. Details are **online**.
