The first Sweet Sippin' Sunday of the season is May 4 in Genoa.

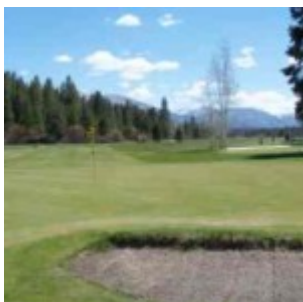
On that particular day participants will also get into one of the Genoa Cowboy Festival events with a Sippin' ticket.
