Consultant to give business talk

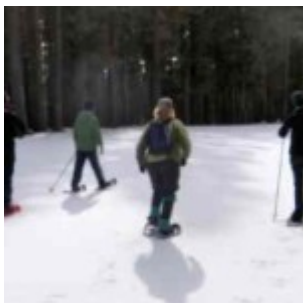
