

Geotourism Expo to show off Tahoe region

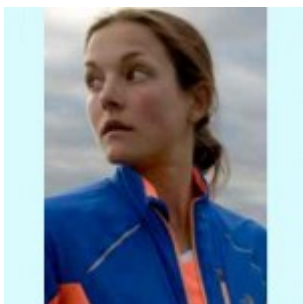
The annual Tahoe Geotourism Expo is designed to showcase the treasures of Tahoe.
