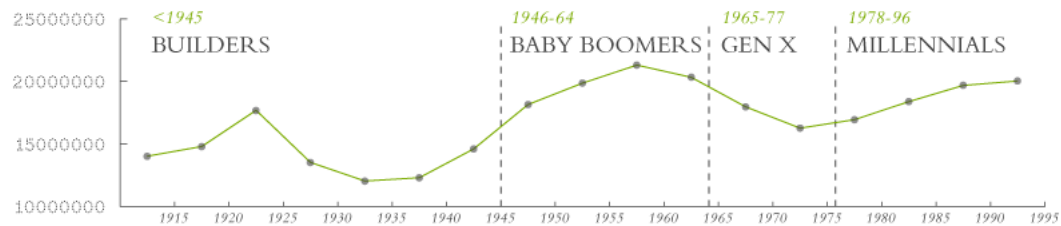
THE GENERATION GAP IN YOUR OFFICE

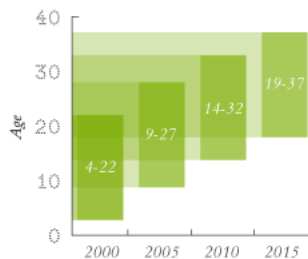

NUMBER OF BIRTHS BY YEAR



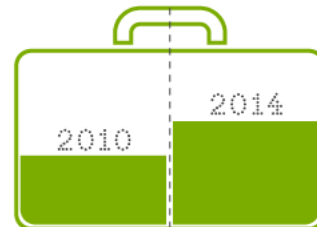
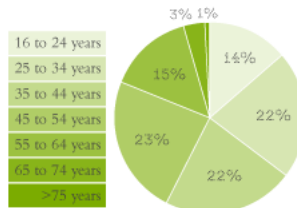
BREAKDOWN OF MILLENNIAL AGES OVER TIME
