- Tucked off on the right side of Lake Tahoe Boulevard near Angora Creek just before Dead Man's Curve is a labyrinth on a parcel that backs to the burn area that was created by Jay Newburgh.

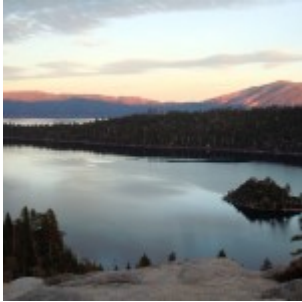
I-80 delays expected Saturday as Caltrans works on bridge

Motorists are advised to plan ahead and factor in additional travel time for Saturday morning on westbound Interstate 80 near the Colfax area.

All Interstate 80 westbound traffic will be detoured at the Eagle Lake off-ramp June 16 from 5am-1pm. A contractor is scheduled to replace the bridge approach slabs.

This work is part of the \$167 million Emigrant Gap project on Interstate 80. Work includes total roadway replacement with Portland Cement Concrete, improving the drainage systems and installing new sediment/debris collection systems. Completion is expected in fall 2013.
