The on ramp from southbound Highway 89 to eastbound Interstate 80, as well as the off ramp from Interstate 80 to central Truckee will be closed Aug. 15 from 7am-5pm for maintenance work.

Caltrans maintenance crews will be repairing areas of the ramp's shoulders that sustained damage during the past winter's storms. Preventing further erosion of the ramp's pavement and shoulders will help mitigate further damage anticipated from future winter storms.

Caltrans reminds motorists to use caution in and near work zones. Weather or unexpected events may delay or prolong the work.
