Survey focuses on roads in South Lake Tahoe

South Lake Tahoe wants people to take **this survey** about improving the city's roads.

South Lake Tahoe's roads need significant updates to fix underlying structural conditions, potholes and cracks that present safety concerns for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians. The city is exploring options for improving infrastructure to meet modern standards.

The City Council is considering placing a a measure on the November ballot that would increase the local sales tax by one-half percent to fund local road improvements.
