El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday April 29 – May 5, 2012

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work continues on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County to add bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County. **No traffic interfering work is scheduled.**

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work continues on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a

bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected this summer.

April 29 – May 5

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Missouri Flat Road to Placerville Drive (Forni Road/ Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do highway construction.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work will resume mid May on a \$40.6 million project to widen shoulders, construct new sidewalks, add bike lanes, install new roadside drainage systems and improve signal operations from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Blvd. Completion is expected in 2013.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Lardin Way to Robert Avenue: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado and Placer Counties) from State Route 193 to the Nevada County line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at the Greenstone Road undercrossing to Missouri Flat Road overcrossing: Motorists can expect #2 westbound lane and ramp restrictions from **7 p.m. to 9 a.m. Friday through Sunday.** A contractor is scheduled to do roadway excavation.
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from the Carson Creek Bridge to Ponderosa Road: Motorists can expect #1 & #2 east and westbound lane restrictions from **7 p.m. to 8 a.m. Sunday through Saturday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to install K-rail.
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Twin Bridges Road to F Street: Motorists can expect #1 & #2 east and westbound lane restrictions from **7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Thursday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.
- **US Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from the South Fork American River to Pyramid Creek: Motorists can expect intermittent one-way traffic controls from **8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do drainage work.
- **US Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Trout Creek to Los Angeles Boulevard: Motorists can expect the eastbound #1 lane closed from **7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do drainage work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Fairway Drive to Tahoe Park Avenue: Motorists can expect the north and southbound #1 lanes closed from **7:30 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do tree work.

The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
