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El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday September 30 – October 6, 2012

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work resumes on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County to add bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County.

Sept. 30 – Oct. 6

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake undercrossing to Shingle Springs Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to install k-rail and perform grinding and paving work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work resumes on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a





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bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected 2012.

Sept. 30 – Oct. 6

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Missouri Flat Road to Placerville Drive (Forni Road/ Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do highway construction.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work resumes on a \$40.6 million project to widen shoulders, construct new sidewalks, add bike lanes, install new roadside drainage systems and improve signal operations from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Blvd. Completion is expected in 2012-2013 weather permitting.

Sept. 30 – Oct. 6

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Fremont Avenue to Ski Run Boulevard: Motorists can expect #1,#2 eastbound lanes and shoulders restrictions all traffic will be shifted to the westbound lane with up to 10 minute delays from **11 p.m. Sunday through 3 p.m. Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to replace the shoulders, grinding and paving work for the next three weeks. (24 hr work)

State Route 89 (Placer County) Work has begun on a \$34 million project to rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, realign the road, and widen shoulders to allow bicycles and places for cars to pull out of traffic from Tahoe City to Tahoma. Completion is expected in 2016.

Sept. 30 – Oct. 6

State Route 89 (Placer County) from McKinney Drive to Mckinney Rubicon Springs Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to **20 minute delays beginning from 5:30 a.m. Monday and continuing through noon Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work. (24 hr work)

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Grimsel Pass Road to Oak Street: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to **20 minute delays**





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beginning at 5:30 a.m. Monday and continuing through noon Friday. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work. (24 hr work)

State Route 89 (Placer County) Work has begun on a \$7.2 million project to do in-place recycling at various locations and placing overlay on Highway 89 from West River Street to Squaw Valley Road from edge of pavement to edge of pavement. Completion is expected late October 2012.

Sept. 30 – Oct. 6

State Route 89 (Placer County) Squaw Valley Road to West River Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to **20 minute delays from 7p.m. to 2 p.m. Sunday through Thursday (ending noon Friday).** A contractor is scheduled to do striping work. (Shuttle service for cyclist is provided)

SPECIAL EVENTS

On **State Highways 89, 28, 50 and 267** in the Tahoe Basin: Motorists can expect restricted lane and temporary closures at various locations. State Route 28 (Placer County) from Lardin Way to Ridgewood Road: Motorists can expect intermittent east and westbound #1 lane restrictions from **7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday (noon Friday).** A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at the Latrobe Road undercrossing (El Dorado Hills Boulevard): Motorists can expect westbound ramp closure from **9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Saturday (6 a.m. Saturday)**. A contractor is scheduled to do striping work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) on Highway 50 to El Dorado Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound ramp closure from **10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Sawmill undercrossing (Cedar Grove/ Ridgeway) : Motorists can expect east and westbound #1,#2 lane restrictions from **midnight to 11 a.m. Sunday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Sly Park Road (Pollock Pines / Pony Express): Motorists can expect eastbound lane restrictions from **1 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Ward Avenue & Sunnyside to Fir Avenue: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to **10 minute delays beginning at 8 a.m. Monday through Wednesday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) at Alpine Meadows Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound #1 lane restrictions **beginning from 1 a.m. to 10 a.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) at Squaw Valley Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound #1 lane restrictions **beginning from 1 a.m. to 10 a.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) at the Silver Creek Campground: Motorists can expect north and southbound #1 lane restrictions **beginning from 1 a.m. to 10 a.m. Tuesday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Graybar Mine Road to Greenwood Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Main Street in Georgetown to Meadowbrook Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Shoo Fly Road to South Fork American River (Chili Bar): Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **midnight through 5 p.m. Sunday through Saturday September 12 – November 1**. A contractor is scheduled to set k-rail to do miscellaneous road work. Narrow lanes advise truck to use alternate routes. (24 hour restrictions)

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State Route 267 (Placer County) at Airport Road/ Schaffer Mill: Motorists can expect north and southbound #1 restrictions with up to 10 minute delays from **1 a.m. to 8 a.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Airport Road/ Schaffer Mill to Martis Creek Wildlife Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to 10 minute delays from **7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday (noon Friday)**. A contractor is scheduled to do electrical work.
