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El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday December 2, 2012 to December 8, 2012

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work continues on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County adding bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County. Completion is expected late November 2012.

December 2 - December 8

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake undercrossing to Ponderosa Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work continues on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected January 2013.

December 2 - December 8

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Missouri Flat Road to Placerville Drive (Forni Road/ Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures with up to 5 minute delays from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do highway construction.

December 2 - December 8

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at the East and Westbound Placerville Drive undercrossing: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls with up to 5 minutes delays **6 a.m. to 3 p.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to remove the rock berm located between the onramp and Placerville Drive.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work continues on a \$40.6 million project we've widen shoulders, constructed new sidewalks, added bike lanes, installed new roadside drainage systems and working on signal operations from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Blvd. Landscaping is scheduled for spring 2013. Completion is expected in summer 2013. **No traffic-interfering work is scheduled.**

State Route 89 (Placer County) Work continues through mid November on a \$34 million project to rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, realign the road, and widen shoulders to allow bicycles and places for cars to pull out of traffic from Tahoe City to Tahoma. Completion is expected in 2016. **No traffic-interfering work is scheduled.**

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Beach Avenue to Secline Street: Motorists can expect eastbound #2 lane and shoulder restrictions from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do sewer work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado and Placer Counties) from State Route 193 in Cool to the Bear River bridge at the Placer County line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Cameron Park : Motorists can expect east and westbound lane and ramp closures with up to five minute delays from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m.**





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Sunday through Saturday. A contractor is scheduled to do roadway excavation for sign footings.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
