SIERRA ROADWORK SCHEDULE

Sunday through Saturday
January 26 – February 1, 2014

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

Interstate 80 (Placer and Nevada Counties) from Carpenter Flat to Hampshire Rock: Work continues on the \$105 million Emigrant Gap project on Interstate 80. Work includes total roadway replacement with Portland Cement Concrete, improving the drainage systems and installing new sediment/debris collection systems. **This project is now complete**

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 49 (El Dorado and Placer Counties) from State Route 193 to the Bear River Bridge: Motorists can expect intermittent one-way traffic controls from **7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

State Route 49 (Placer County) from Lincoln Way to Elm Avenue in Auburn: Motorists can expect the north and southbound #2 lanes closed from **8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do permit work.

State Route 49 (Placer County) from Cottage Drive to Joeger Road in Auburn: Motorists can expect the north and southbound #2 and right shoulders closed from **8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do permit work.

State Route 49 (Placer County) from Masters Court/Golden Chain to Bell Road: Motorists can expect the south- and northbound #3 lanes closed from **9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Thursday and Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.



State Route 49 (Yuba and Sutter Counties) from Marysville Road to Shangri-La Drive: Motorists can expect intermittent one-way traffic controls from **7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

Interstate 80 (Nevada County) from east of the Kingvale exit to the beginning of the chain control area: Motorists can expect various west- and eastbound lane restrictions from **7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to clean drainage areas.

Interstate 80 (Nevada and Placer Counties) from Yuba Gap to Kingvale: Motorists can expect various east- and westbound lane restrictions from **7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do guardrail repair.

Interstate 80 (Placer County) from Blue Canyon to Drum Forebay: Motorists can expect westbound lane restrictions from **7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday and Wednesday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to sign work.

Interstate 80 (Placer County) from Gold Run to State Route 193: Motorists can expect various eastbound lane restrictions from **7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

State Route 89 (Sierra County) from the Cottonwood Campground to Old Truckee Road: Motorists can expect the #1 southbound lane closed from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do guardrail repair.

State Route 89 (Sierra County) from Main Street to the Calpine Summit: Motorists can expect various north- and southbound lane restricts from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do maintenance work.

State Route 174 (Nevada County) from State Route 49 to Park Street: Motorists can expect the right shoulders closed from **9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 174 (Nevada and Placer Counties) from Brockway Road to Martis Creek Lake Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do grinding operations.

State Route 174 (Placer County) from the Ranger's Station to the passing lane: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday and Tuesday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do grinding operations.

The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above. Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.).
