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Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, May 11-17, 2014

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work continues on a \$41 million project from Tahoma to Tahoe City on Lake Tahoe's West Shore that will upgrade storm water drainage and treatment systems, add curbs and gutters, resurface and realign the road and widen shoulders. Sections of the bike trail will also be revamped. Completion is expected in fall 2016.

May 12-16

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Wilson Avenue to Tahoe Tavern Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various around the clock from 7 a.m. Monday until **noon Friday** for drainage and utility work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work continues on a \$20 million water-quality project from 0.1 mile north of the Eagle Falls Sidehill Viaduct No. 5 to Meeks Creek Bridge in Meeks Bay. This project will add new drainage features, curb and gutter, and resurface a nearly 7-mile stretch of the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2015.

May 12-16

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Meeks Creek to Victoria Drive: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday** and from **6 a.m. to 11 a.m. Friday** for drainage work.

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work continues on Placer County's \$36.7 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from State Route 267 to Chipmunk Street. The project will install curbs, sidewalks, roundabouts and drainage systems to enhance pedestrian and bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements. May 11-16

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Coon Street to Chipmunk Street: Westbound motorists can expect the #1 lane and right shoulder closed around the clock from **midnight Sunday until 5 p.m. Friday** for utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work is set to resume May 19 on a \$12.1 million water-quality and roadway improvement project from the "Y" intersection of Highways 50 and 89 to the South Lake Tahoe Airport adding curbs, gutters, sidewalks, new drainage systems and repaving the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2014. **No traffic-interfering work is scheduled.**

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) near South Lake Tahoe: Work is under way on a \$15.3 million water-quality project from Johnson Pass Road to Incline Road in Meyers to install new drainage systems, widen shoulders, add bike lanes and restore a section of the exiting bike path.

May 12-16

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Johnson Pass Road to Sawmill Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 6 a.m. to 11 a.m. Friday** for drainage work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in Pollock Pines: Work continues on a \$7.67 million project to replace the bridge over Sly Park Road. The project will also add sidewalks to both sides of Sly Park Road, curbs, curb ramps and gutters. Completion is expected in November 2014. **No traffic-interfering work is scheduled.**

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County): Work continues on an \$18.5 million project by El Dorado County to reconstruct the U.S. Highway 50 ramps to El Dorado Hills Boulevard and Latrobe Road in El Dorado Hills. U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Latrobe Road/El Dorado Hills Boulevard: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect the #3 lane closed from **9 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday** for bridge work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County): Work is under way on a \$57 million project by El





Dorado County to construct a new overcrossing over U.S. Highway 50, new on- and off-ramps with signalized intersections, and new bicycle and pedestrian facilities at Silva Valley Parkway in El Dorado Hills. U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Latrobe Road/El Dorado Hills Boulevard to the Carson Creek Bridge: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday** for bridge work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Sierra Real Road to China Hill Road in El Dorado: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday** for utility work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Ryan Drive to Commerce Way near Diamond Springs: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. to 7 a.m. Monday through Saturday** for electrical work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Spring Street to Vivian Court in Placerville: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday** for utility work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Coloma Heights Road to the Coloma School House: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. for utility work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Pedro Hills Road to Saint Florian Court in Cool: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **6 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday** for fence work.





U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Coloma Street to Bedford Avenue in Placerville: Westbound motorists can expect the #2 lane closed from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Friday for utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at the South Fork of the American River east of White Hall: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from **6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday and midnight to 3 p.m. Saturday** for bridge work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Upper Trucker River Bridge and Trout Creek Bridge in South Lake Tahoe: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from **6 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday and midnight to 3 p.m. Friday** for striping and inspection.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Ski Run Boulevard: Westbound motorists can expect the #2 lane and shoulder closed **from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 6 a.m. to noon Friday** for drainage work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from the junction of State Route 49 to American River Road in Cool: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Friday** for fence work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Penobscot Road to Main Street in Greenwood: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday** for utility work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Traverse Creek Road to Garden Valley Road in Garden Valley: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday** for highway construction.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
