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Sierra Roadwork Schedule, Sunday through Saturday, May 10-16

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

Interstate 80 (Placer County) from Brace Road to Magra Road: Work continues on a \$36 million project to increase the vertical clearance of nine bridge structures in south Placer County to 16 feet, 6 inches. The vertical clearance will be increased on six structures by lifting the existing bridge deck and the other three will have the roadway below dug down. <u>May 10-16</u>

Interstate 80 (Placer County) from Sierra College Boulevard to Newcastle Road: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures and onramp closures from **8 p.m. to 9 a.m. Sunday through Friday** for bridge work. Motorists also can expect one-way traffic control from **6 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday** on the Brace, Gilardi, Horseshoe Bar, King, Penryn and Magra overcrossings for bridge work.

<u>May 10-16</u>

Interstate 80 (Placer County) at Weimar Cross Road overcrossing: Motorists can expect eastbound Interstate 80 to be restricted to one lane for approximately threequarters of a mile under the overcrossing from 8 p.m. Sunday May 10 through 5 a.m. May 22. Delays of of 15 to 30 minutes throughout the project with significantly longer delays of up to 90 minutes on Friday May 15 and Saturday May 16. Westbound traffic will not be affected.





Interstate 80 (Placer County) at Weimar Cross Road overcrossing: Motorists can expect the eastbound Interstate 80 on and off ramps will be closed at Weimar Cross Road in Placer County from **Sunday April 19 through May 22** as part of the "Raise 80" vertical clearance project.

State Route 89 (Placer/Nevada County) at the Union Pacific Railroad undercrossing south of Interstate 80: Ground breaking on April 2 to officially begin project to construct a pedestrian and bicycle tunnel under the Union Pacific Railroad adjacent to the existing SR 89 undercrossing and construct a Class I paved trail along the east side of SR 89 between Deerfield Drive and West River Street.

<u>May 10-16</u>

State Route 89 (Placer/Nevada County) from West River Street to Deerfield Drive: Motorists can expect one way traffic controls through the tunnel from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday May 11 through Friday May 8 for shoulder work and roadway excavation.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

Interstate 80 – Eastbound (Placer County) from the just west of Blue Canyon Road to the Nyack Road Undercrossing: Motorists can expect lane and left shoulder closures from **7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday May 11 through Thursday May 14** for maintenance operations.

Interstate 80 – Eastbound (Placer County) from the just west Crystal Lake Road to the California/Nevada border: Motorists can expect lane and left shoulder closures from **7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday May 11** for striping operations.

Interstate 80 (Nevada County) from the Floriston interchange to the Farad Undercrossing/Mystic Road: Motorists can expect alternating lane closures from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday May 11 through Friday May 14 for bridge work.

State Route 89 (Sierra County) from Lemon Canyon Road to Filippini Road: Motorists can expect one way traffic controls from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday May 11 through Thursday May 14 for crack seal operations.

State Route 89 (Sierra County) from the North Yuba River Bridge to Wild Plum Road: Motorists can expect one way traffic controls from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday May 11 through Thursday May 14 for ditch cleaning.

State Route 49 and State Route 20 (Nevada/Yuba Counties) The Rotary Club of Grass Valley is holding the 2nd Annual Gold Country Cycling Challenge on **Saturday, May 9 from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.** on portions of **S.R.49 and 20** in the Nevada City and Grass Valley area. The California Highway Patrol will be providing support and safety services.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above. Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.).
