Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, June 26 – July 2, 2016

NOTE: Most traffic-interfering work will be restricted from 5 a.m. Friday, July 1 until 8 p.m. Tuesday, July 5 due to the Fourth of July holiday weekend.

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work continues on a \$70.1 million project from Tahoma to just north of Granlibakken Road in Tahoe City that is upgrading storm water drainage and treatment systems, adding curb and gutter, resurfacing and realigning the road, adding new left-turn pockets and widening shoulders on an 8-mile stretch of the highway. Completion is expected by summer 2017.

June 26-July 1

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Oroville Street to Sugar Pine Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations around the clock from 10 p.m. Sunday until 7 p.m. Thursday for curb and gutter work and drainage work. Motorists also can expect one-way traffic control from Sequoia Avenue North to Cathedral Way from 10 p.m. Sunday to 10 a.m. Monday, 7 p.m. to 10 a.m. Monday through Thursday and 7 p.m. Thursday to 6 a.m. Friday for pavement work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work continues on a \$13 million water quality improvement project from Cascade Road to just north of the Eagle Falls Viaduct over Emerald Bay. The project is constructing new drainage facilities to treat stormwater runoff and repaving a four-mile section of the highway. Completion is expected in summer 2017.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Cascade Road to Eagle Point







Campground: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **2** a.m. to noon Monday through Thursday for drainage and shoulder work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work continues on a \$25 million project from the "Y" junction with U.S. Highway 50 in South Lake Tahoe to Cascade Road, north of Camp Richardson. Curb, gutter and sidewalks will be added in the 1.1-mile four-lane section, and the highway will be widened in the two-lane section to Visitor Center Road to provide 4-foot paved shoulders on each side. Drainage systems are also being built and the roadway is being resurfaced. Completion is expected this fall.

June 27-30

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from 12th Street to West Way: Northbound and southbound motorists can expect the #2 lane and shoulder closed from **7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday** for curb, gutter and sidewalk work. Motorists also can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from the Tahoe Visitors Center to Cascade Road from **midnight to 6 a.m. Monday** and **6 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday** for pavement work.

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work continues on Placer County's \$50 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from State Route 267 to Chipmunk Street. Highway work includes installing curb and gutter, sidewalks, roundabouts, lighting and drainage systems to enhance pedestrian and bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements. State Route 28 (Placer County) from the junction with State Route 267 to Chipmunk Street: Motorists can expect the #1 lane closed from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday for striping. Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from Beach Avenue to Deer Street from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Friday for utility work. Motorists also can expect the eastbound and westbound shoulders to be closed from Fox Street to Beaver Street from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday for utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County): The Silva Valley Interchange, a \$57 million project by El Dorado County to construct a new overcrossing over U.S. Highway 50 in El Dorado Hills, is now open to traffic, but some highway lane closures may still be required to finish the work.
