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Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, November 27 - December 3, 2016

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work is in **winter suspension** on a \$70.1 million project from Tahoma to Granlibakken Road in Tahoe City that is upgrading storm water drainage and treatment systems, adding curb and gutter, resurfacing and realigning the road, adding new left-turn pockets and widening shoulders on an 8-mile stretch of the highway. Completion is expected in summer 2017.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work is **complete** on a \$13 million water quality improvement project from Cascade Road to the Eagle Falls Viaduct over Emerald Bay. The project is constructing new drainage facilities to treat stormwater runoff and repaving a four-mile section of the highway. Completion is expected in later this fall.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work is **complete** on a \$25 million project from the "Y" junction with U.S. Highway 50 in South Lake Tahoe to Cascade Road, north of Camp Richardson. Curb, gutter and sidewalks are being built in the 1.1-mile four-lane section, and the highway will be widened in the two-lane section to Visitor Center Road to provide 4-foot paved shoulders on each side. Drainage systems are also being built and the roadway is being resurfaced.

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work is **complete** on Placer County's \$50 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from State Route 267 to Chipmunk Street. Highway work includes installing curb and gutter, sidewalks, roundabouts, lighting and drainage systems to enhance pedestrian and bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements. Completion is expected this fall.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County) from the Tahoe City Transit Center to the Pfeifer House: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control and intermittent full highway closures at various locations from **8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday** for tree work.





State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Spring Creek Road to Cascade Creek: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday** for tree work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above. Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.).
